Treasurer's Report by Aaron: September 2017 report and incomplete Pumpkin Festival report (see Aaron to provide)

Building report by David Eberle: Roof over the shed and the corner by the podium have been repaired. Next will be the woodwork above the mason work.

Woody report by the Captains (Ben, Tom and Steve): Derigging most of the boat this past Wednesday. The boom was brought into the building. Sails, spars, blocks, and lines from the deck are off. Some times this week, the removed items will be brought to the coop. Tomorrow at 8am to noon, there will be a harbor work party. The topmast may be removed tomorrow afternoon but will need help hauling Steve up – please see Steve. If all is done this week, then possibly this weekend the Woody will motor to Haverstraw for in-water storage. This area is predominantly in salt water to help preserve our large investment. A lot winterizing work is left. Looking forward to a very full sailing program in the next season. We still had some guest sails and took 74 guests out with sails during the pumpkin festival. We will be restoring the sailing program for the spring.

Pumpkin Festival report by Rosemary Thomas: We baked 125 pumpkin pies that were delicious. Wonderful event with wonderful musicians, wonderful volunteers, everything came together. Thank you for making this successful for the club.

Little Boxes report by Susan (event on 11/18): This is one of our two big Woody fundraisers. The event will be at the Red Barn starting at 6pm. If you would like to enter, you can buy a 3x3 canvas for \$25 with a theme of the Hudson River. Purchasing the canvas is your ticket to the event. Food and wine is donated. There will be a silent auction – half to the artist and half to the Club. If you would like to enter without a canvas, the admission is \$15. This year's music is provided by Mark McNutt. Flyers are available to help publicize the event. River Winds art gallery is collecting all the finished canvases by the Friday before the event. The art is hung early Saturday morning and takes time to set up. Tickets are also available at Brown Paper Tickets and River Winds can give you the canvas.
