The Strawberry festival is this coming Sunday June 15<sup>th</sup>. We need everyone on Board, there are plenty of jobs to do and we need volunteers to do them. Among the jobs are baking biscuits, preparing strawberries, making whip cream and then selling the shortcake. We also need strong able bodied men or women to help with set up and clean up. ## **The Beacon Mural**

A contract between Jim Price the artist and the beacon Sloop club has been signed and a check in the amount of \$1850 was passed to Jim. This leaves a balance of \$6500. A grant has been submitted to the arts council for an additional \$3000 dollars.

Some of the suggestions of people who viewed the mock up have been taken into account and changes have been made in the mural. We will not own the Mural so we will not be responsible for maintaining and repairing it if that is necessary. It is a gift of the Beacon Sloop Club to the Beacon Community.

## **Strawberry Festival**

### **Strawberry tent**

The New Strawberry tent has arrived and has been examined. It looks great and will make a very dramatic statement at the festival. It was noted that the manufacturer has re-called these tents because they are not properly fireproofed. We elected not to return the tent because we would only get a refund and then would have to find another tent. In addition we will not be having any fires or hot objects under the tent.

### **Building a new Strawberry Trailer**

We have an old camping trailer that can serve as the foundation. It would need walls, insulation, shelves, and air conditioning. Volunteers can do the work, as it is not complicated.

### **Publicity**

New signs and posters have been made, they look great. Well done. We also have new brochures to give to the public when they sail on the Woody.

### **Greeters**

We will have greeters passing out information about the sloop club who will be trying to attract new members and/or donations.

### **Waste Collection**

A letter has been sent to all vendors indicating that since we are an environmental organization, we would sincerely appreciate their using degradable cups, plates and utensils. A way of obtaining these commodities was provided. We are still working out a waste disposal system.

## From Riverkeeper:

On the heels of Riverkeeper's Hudson Fisheries Defense Campaign launch, Governor takes needed actions. We are very pleased to report that Governor Paterson has launched a decisive new program aimed at rebuilding and protecting fish species in the Hudson River. The governor's initiative comes just two weeks after the release on May 15 of Riverkeeper's report, The Status of Fish Populations and the Ecology of the Hudson (the Pisces Report) (<http://ga1.org/t/KdxakT71XmSy/>) and the launch of our Hudson Fisheries Defense Campaign. That the governor took immediate action is a testament to the effectiveness of Riverkeeper's work to protect Hudson River fish.

The Governor's recovery plan for American shad, to be implemented by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), includes nearly all of Riverkeeper's recommended actions to protect the shad. These efforts will also benefit other imperiled fish species.

We applaud Governor Paterson and DEC commissioner Grannis for their leadership on this important issue! But one more critical step is needed. We need your help to tell the commissioner that the most important achievable action -requiring closed-cycle cooling at the five Hudson River power plants - must be undertaken immediately as a protective measure for all our fish. Please send a letter to Commissioner Grannis urging him to adopt closed-cycle cooling as policy for all power plants.

### Relationship with the City of Beacon

David Cohen is working on a document to formalize our relationship with the city of Beacon with regard to using property at the University Settlement and with regard to the Sloop Clubs presence at the Waterfront. This is going slowly, because the city has not yet determined what this relationship should be, including whether we should pay rent. We need to counter this by informing the City Council of what the Sloop Club brings to the City of Beacon. And this is what David is doing. We also need to get a group of Sloop Club members who reside in Beacon and can be a vocal presence when these topics are brought up for discussion.

### Grants Committee

There are Grants available through the DEC regarding the quadricentennial. Money is available for improvements in river access. We are looking into the possibility of writing a grant.


