Beacon Sloop Club General Meeting

Minutes, March 4, recorded by Tom Elliott

Ken, Lydia, and Ben gave us *Rainbow Race*, and Rob brought the meeting to order at 7:36 p.m., welcoming all. He reminded us that we are a carry in/carry out facility. He also asked if there were any first-time visitors, and the club welcomed Bill from Highland Falls, NY. Then Rob led us in a moment of silence, recognizing the passing of Flora and Connie.

Treasurer's Report: Aaron gave the Treasurer's report for January, which is in the newsletter, below.

Verplanck Coast Guard Auxiliary: Rob welcomed a contingent of the Verplanck Coast Guard Auxiliary serving the Hudson River Indian Point area. Eugene Yetter and Charles Fitzpatrick, led by Flotilla Commander Mathew Duteau, told us about their programs available now in an expanded service area which includes Cold Spring and north to above Poughkeepsie. Mr. Yetter and Mr. Fitzpatrick told us about their programs that focus on recreational as well as professional boater safety. A core Boating Safety Class they offer will be required for all boaters in New York starting in 2024. The Coast Guard Auxiliary flotillas are community service arms of the Coast Guard, and do not extend into any law enforcement or military areas. The Flotilla wants to reach out to boaters and boating organizations in their service area. to offer classes and other boating safety services. They offered to send a detail to help with our Beacon Harbor May 7 River Sweep program! Well received by BSC members, there were many good guestions asked and answered. Thanks, Gentlemen!

Election of Secretary: Rob told us that our secretary has resigned, so a new candidate must be found. Susan nominated Vickie Fox, who accepted the nomination. Tom Elliott seconded the nomination. Rob then asked three times if there were any new nominations, and being none, he called for a vote by show of hands. Vickie was elected. Congratulations!

Woody Report: Captain Steve said that there will be a Woody Sailors meeting on- line Sunday at 7 p.m. The agenda will mostly be about the de-winterizing of the boat, and schedule options related to getting the boat out of the water for a short time to do bottom work. The schedule involves pulling the boat out in Haverstraw to do the bottom work, and to convert the winter cover frame to a bolt-together kit. Then transit to Beacon by the first or second week of April to up-rig. The cost of pull-out services at Haverstraw may not meet our budget, however, so other options are being considered. Captain Tom noted that a number of crew members sailing on various nights are not officially club members, but really must be so that the Club's insurance will cover them while sailing and during maintenance parties.

Building Report: Tom L. reported that our current alarm has become obsolete due to an outdated motherboard. This is on order and our service team is trying to push it, knowing we are in need. Hopefully we will have some word by early next week. Tom will follow through until the work is complete. Captain Steve asked if the Woody and the Tender can be alarmed in the new system. Tom replied affirmatively and said a cost proposal has been requested.

River Sweep: Joyce told us that The 2022 River sweep cleanup will be held on May 7th. We will meet outside the Beacon Sloop Club. Sign up information will be available on the Riverkeeper River Sweep site after March 21, 2022. Also, we are **In need of someone with a pickup truck** to drive to the transfer station with the trash from the cleanup. Please call Joyce at (914) 907-4928 if you can do it. Joyce also urged us to call and write to Gov. Hochul and oppose her EPR budget Proposal. Ask the Governor to support a strong Extended Producer Responsibility bill, namely the Producer Responsibility bill proposed by NYS Assembly member Engelbright. Unfortunately, the legislation now being considered by the NYS Senate does not do enough. It is favorable to the plastic and packaging industries, allowing them to make up the rules and define who is accountable. It will send New York on the wrong path.

Lectures: Alan thanked everybody who came out for Guy Davis live last month, calling it a great event and our first live Lecture Series event in two years. He asks members who may have video to please not post anywhere due to copyright rules. March 17 is the next lecture with Sam Merrett, captain of the Apollonia coming to us virtually on Zoom. Please sign up now for this talk on the future of carbon-free freight service on the Hudson. Saturday, April 2 at 11:00 a.m., the DEC Eel Project educators will deliver a special program live at the Clubhouse. This is of particular interest to teachers and students. Alan will need some setup help on this, so contact him if you can come to help.

Clearwater Update: Rosemary said Clearwater's economic health is improving, and with the guidance of new director, David Toman, and a full operational season ahead, things will improve even more. Winter restoration work is wrapping up by the end of April, and Clearwater will be back in the water in May. BSC is taking out a half page ad in the Gala Program book. Also, we will plan a new fundraiser this year to provide further support. Clearwater recognizes the club's efforts, so please support the April 3 Gala if you can. Rob thanked Rosemary, telling us David Toman plans to visit the sloop club next month at our Friday meeting.

Environmental Report: Captain Tom asked us all to support 10 cent deposits on all recyclable bottles and cans, citing that method as the best way to ensure recycling really happens. Also, before you buy, sit and ask yourself, "why?" Remember, the first "R" is reduce. Rob thanked Tom for his report.

Announcements: Alan asked us to save the date July 30 for the 2022 Great Hudson River Swim. Registration online opens in April, and more kayakers are needed to act as guides this year. Rain date is 7/31. Susan has two antigen test kits to give to anyone able to visit Betty Harkins at North Westchester Restorative Therapy and Nursing Center. Lydia says she can and took the test. Thanks, Lydia! Rob told us that there is a CLCP march on March 8 in Albany at 6 p.m. It kicks off at 100 State St., in support of a bill to help the environment. Woody and Pete will be there in spirit.

At 8:45 p.m. with no further announcements, it was moved and seconded that the meeting adjourn, and the Circle of Song began.

Come to the waterfront to learn about one of the Hudson River's most mysterious inhabitants. NYS DEC's Benjamin Harris will review what is known of these fascinating fish, and opportunities to participate as a Citizen Scientist in the Hudson River Eel Project.



Each Spring, members of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation carry out a monitoring program across the Hudson River to assess juvenile American eels. The American eel (Anguilla rostrata) is a migratory fish; baby eels arrive all across the East coast from the Sargasso Sea each year to live out their lives in freshwater tributaries before returning to the ocean to spawn.


