### **Beacon Sloop Club General Meeting**

Minutes, April 1, recorded by Vicki Fox

Rob, Lydia, Bonnie and Ken opened the meeting with "Quite Early Morning".

Aaron gave the Treasurer's Report. To answer a question about Woody Nickels, they don't send us a check every month.

Rob announced the Connie Hogarth tribute at the Towne Crier Sunday April 3 at 6:30. It's the first of many events to be held in Connie's honor. Phil Ciganer is not charging admission.

Clearwater's Executive Director, David Toman, addressed us. He's been on the job since January 15, but has worked for non-profits for over 25 years, at the Delaware Nature Society and the Mohonk Preserve-- his background is in Business Administration and Accounting, an area that Clearwater is in need of. Though most of the Clearwater staff is still working remotely, David is at the office two days a week and can be reached at 845-443-1439 (his cell) or by email: exec@clearwater.org or david@clearwater.org. Clearwater passed a new strategic plan December 8. The environmental focus is still on the Hudson River and region; Danskammer, PCB clean-up, the decommissioning of Indian Point, Newburgh's water pipes and environmental justice issues.

Joyce raised the point that in previous years, Clearwater has hosted our sloop club for a sail, but it hasn't happened for two years. Rosemary described the difficulty of scheduling sails for all the different clubs, plus the complications of Covid. "I'm going to make an inflammatory comment," said Rosemary; "How about if a sloop club has fewer than five members, they may not get a sail?" Dave Toman said he did not have previous experience with the sailing side of the organization. and "I will get more engaged to understand scheduling the sails." As far as the Revival is concerned, it's not happening in 2022, but that doesn't mean it won't happen again. David said if it comes back, it has to come back prudently, to benefit Clearwater. The Strategic Plan's top priorities include keeping music to engage the community, but it needs to be done prudently. "This is an organization that needs to be here for a long time."

Max Smith, the new head of Woody maintenance, gave the Woody report. The Woody is at Haverstraw Marina. The big project has been the creation of a tent that goes over the hull once the mast and bowsprit are off to protect the boat against the winter. We need volunteers to get the frame off the boat and the bowsprit installed.

Steve said we need 4-5 volunteers this weekend. Max said, "A lot of what we're working with is temperature-sensitive so it's hard to give notice" -- a lot will depend on the weather. Volunteer updates are on the BSC Facebook page, and the schedule is usually 10-4. Max said the boat will be hauled out April 8 or 11 and then it needs to be painted. Hope to transit to Beacon after April 15. Someone asked, "what if the boat is hauled out and it needs to be more than painted?" Max said he examined the hull, and while it looks like there's water in the bottom of the boat from the deck, the keel is relatively dry. That's a good sign.

Building Report - Dave Eberle was not present.

Joyce announced that the Riversweep is Saturday, May 7 and sign-up is going live tomorrow on the BSC Facebook page. We'll gather at 9:15 and have a teach-in about invasives and plastic; we'll start cleaning up around quarter to 10.

Rosemary said she's "beyond thrilled" that we're finally going to have the Strawberry Fest again - June 12. Strawberry prep will be at David Eberle and Margaret DeHeus's house. The next Strawberry Fest committee meeting is April 11.

Winter lecture report: Alan thanked all who heard about the Apollonia which is profitably carrying freight by sail. They will be in Beacon five times this season, carrying raw materials to brewers and other "makers". They will have a CSA for their "boat boxes" filled with manufactured items from the raw cargo shipped on Apollonia. They are also looking for "shore buddies" to help them transport products on shore by electric bike. *schoonerapollonia.com* The last winter lecture, All About Eels, will be at 11am on April 2 at the club. It's for adults and children. There will be live eels and a slideshow.

Rosemary gave the Clearwater Report. The boat is up by Albany. It's on schedule; the mast should be back on by mid-May. Its first sail will probably be Memorial Day weekend. The June educational sails are booked. Summer sails are booked next; they're trying to book as many charters as possible. The Gala is coming up on Sunday. Our Haikootenanny last year raised \$5000 and went to sponsor three school groups. The Newburgh Boys and Girls Club were thrilled to go. Joyce and Rosemary will try to find a way for our club to fund them again.

Bonnie announced the MLK Day Essay award ceremony: May 16 at 7pm; Beacon City Hall. Rhinebeck Bank has donated \$300 for the winners every year for nine years. It's a City Council Meeting. Please come cheer on the kids and come around 6:45.

Vicki asked people to phone assembly people and Carl Heastie in Albany to oppose Gov. Hochul's toothless EPR, which would allow plastic packaging firms to police themselves. Instead, Senator Engelbright's bill would forbid lobbying by the packaging industry, expand the Bottle Bill, forbid toxins in packaging and encourage products to be made with recycled materials. State legislators should support Engelbright's bill instead of a weak EPR that would set New York back and be an antienvironmental role model for the rest of the nation.

Alan added to the Woody Report: Starting April 9 or the week of April 11, we need many volunteers to paint the Woody at Haverstraw. It needs 3 coats of bottom paint, and it takes time for the paint to dry. And we need to get the boat back in the water before the planks dry out.


